



FAMILY INVOLVEMENT

CAMPUS BEAUTIFICATION

PURPOSE: TO ASSIST THE SCHOOL IN MAINTAINING AND ENHANCING THE OVERALL INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR PRESENCE ON THE CAMPUS.

Each student club and team at AHS is assigned a plot of land to maintain. It is the students' and sponsors'/coaches' responsibility to do this, but the Campus Beautification chair works with the principal to provide oversight.

- Communicate with club and team leaders (teachers and students) to make sure they are aware of their responsibilities.
- Supervise clubs and organizations re their maintenance of assigned areas
- If necessary, subdivide areas and/or re-assign.
- Develop a reward system for 'Best Maintained' and 'Best Improved' areas
- Encourage clubs and organizations to participate in the scheduled maintenance days. If this is not possible, they may choose their own day (subject to informing AHS-PTSA)

In addition, the PTSA takes on special projects to enhance the appearance of the school grounds.

- Redefine a 'wish list' of equipment and materials needed.
- Landscape and maintain the two entrances to AHS for PTSA

Set up four workdays, two in the fall (early September and late October) and two in the spring (mid-March and early May),

- This must be done through the school, the day must be approved, and custodian secured.
- Solicit volunteers, from parents and teachers, to oversee what needs to be done on those days.
- Advise clubs and organizations for volunteers from student body to help. The students can use this time for service hours.
- Advertise these days through articles in the electronic newsletter, e-mails to the 'sponsors', posters in the school (these need to be approved for posting), and daily morning announcements the week before the maintenance day
- Purchase mulch, etc. to be used on the workdays.
- Purchase coffee, donuts, juice for refreshments.

PTSA is also responsible for enhancing interior areas with tasteful and appropriate seasonal décor in designated areas.
